Title 1 Federal Funding

- Provides **federal funds** to schools with high percentages of low-income students based on student enrollment, the free and reduced lunch percentage for each school, and other informative data.

What is Title 1?

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Shortridge Title 1

Is schools based on the percentage of students receiving free/reduced lunch.

Provides federal funding to schools to help students who are most risk of falling behind.

Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.

What is the purpose of Title 1

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According to the U.S. Department of Education the purpose of Title 1 funding, “is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.”

School-Wide Program

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- Shortridge uses Title 1 funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
